Read aloud. Reading aloud improves comprehension and retention of information. Develop a picture in your mind of the concepts presented. Visualizing information, concepts or material presented makes it much easier to remember. Highlight. As you read through your text, highlight important passages that support central themes and concepts. Be ...

Study Skills: Strategies for Reading Textbooks

Support students guiding themselves through a preview of the book and thinking about the text. Students may notice the book's format or a particular element of the print. Reading practice—Rotate from student to student while they read quietly or silently.

An anticipation guide is a comprehension strategy that is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic. Before reading, students listen to or read several statements about key concepts presented in the text; they're often structured as a series of statements with which the students can choose to agree or disagree.
